RAGGING

Ragging of all forms is banned. Students indulging in such activities may be penalized and/or rusticated as per Supreme Court directions.

### **Admission Rules**

#### 1. New Admission:

Admission is open to eligible students as per instructions and directions by the Panjab University for all the courses being run by the college.

#### 2. Application form:

Admission to the college will be made on prescribed form obtainable from the college website. A hard copy of filled up form should be handed over to the office after getting it signed by the Admission Committee, complete in all respects. Incomplete forms will not be considered.

#### 3. Students from other colleges:

A student who has passed a class from some other college may join this college for the next higher class but he/she shall produce a college leaving certificate from the previous college through which he/she had appeared in the exam and a character certificate to the satisfaction of the Principal. The Principal can refuse such admission without assigning any reason.

#### 4. Migration Certificate & Fee:

No migration fee will be charged from students who have passed 10+2 Examination from Punjab. H.P., Haryana. Chandigarh and Andaman and Nicobar School Education Boards or from Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi. Also, they are not required to submit migration certificate. Others will be required to submit migration certificate and pay the necessary migration fee.

#### The candidates from other Universities:

Students coming from other Universities must bring with them qualifying examination Certificate at the time of admission. Migration Certificate must be submitted latest by the 30th September in the University office.

Important Note: A student of other University who is placed in compartment in 1st year, 2nd year of B.A./B.Com. will not be allowed to join 2nd year/3rd year Course of this University.

#### 6. Students with gap years:

If the Principal agrees to grant the admission in "Gap Year/s Case" in certain typical cases, then the candidate having gap year will have to submit an affidavit in duplicate to the effect that he/she was not disqualified by any Board/Body/ Council/ University and he/she is not already registered with the Panjab University (wherever applicable) and will also register the cause of gap.

In case the candidate was disqualified, the period of disqualification and the activities in which the candidate was involved during the period of disqualification, should be indicated by the candidate in the said affidavit.

In case of re-admission after a long spell, the candidate must quote his/her old Registration Number of Panjab University.

#### 7. Re-evaluation Case:

If as a result of re-evaluation, a candidate passes the Exam., he/she shall be eligible to seek admission to the next higher class within ten working days of the communication of re-evaluation result to him/her.

However, no candidate would be granted admission on the basis of re-evaluation result after 15th October.

#### Late result Case of +2:

A student whose result of +2 examinations in February/March conducted by a School Board is published late, but not later than 14th August, 2018, may be admitted without late fee within 15 working days of the declaration of the result and his/her attendance shall be counted from the date of admission. This would be applicable to an Open School Board also. After expiry of this period, the approval for late admission is required form the Vice-Chancellor.

#### Note:

- After getting admission approved by the Admission Committee, fee must be deposited on the same day.
- 2. Personal Attendance at the time of admission is necessary.

## **G.T.B. National College**

Dakha (Ludhiana)

### A Multi-faculty, Post-graduate, Co-educational Institution.

Dakha is situated on the Ludhiana-Jagroan-Ferozepur National Highway at a distance of 15 kms from Ludhiana. In 1970s, this village known for General Sant Singh Sekhon and literary stalwart Principal Sant Singh Sekhon, had no college for higher education in the radius of 10 kms though there were two Senior Secondary schools at Dakha and a number of them in the surrounding villages. Higher education was a dream for most of the boys and girls who were otherwise hardworking and ambitious but were lagging behind because of economic, social and locational reasons. This was particularly so in case of girls because of social and cultural inhibitions and taboos of sending the girls to cities.

At the occasion of quincentenary of Guru Nanak Dev Ji in1969, an awakening for the need of higher education was emerging in Rural Punjab and as a result many commemorative colleges were established in 1969-70.

It was in this scenario, that one "visionary" S. Jiwa Singh of this village donated his entire land for this noble cause in 1971. Generous donations poured in by the people of the village DAKHA and of surrounding villages. A Trust known as "Guru Teg Bahadur Charitable Education Trust" was got registered with the Govt. of Punjab as the Management Committee of Guru Teg Bahadur National College, Dakha.

Today, looking back one can understand that the vision of the founders has been realized practically as the dream-venture has bloomed into a Post-Graduate Arts and Commerce College with Post-Graduation in Punjabi, History and Commerce and Under Graduate Course in B.SC (Non-Med.) Also, college has Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application (PGDCA), Post Graduate Diploma in Mass-Communication (PGDMC)

To impart vocational and sophisticated skills, the subject of Fashion Designing,

Fundamentals of Computer Applications, Functional English and Advertising Sales Promotion and Sales Management have been introduced as an elective subject in B.A.

The college has spacious and well-ventilated class rooms for boys and girls. College is proud to have a splendid stadium, named General Sant Singh Stadium. An imposing auditorium with seating arrangement of 1200 individuals has been built up at the cost of Rs. 1 Crore (approx.).

The College library is well stocked with about 16500 volumes, 11 magazines, 35 Journals and 17 newspapers. A well-furnished Girls 'Common Room with T.V., magazines, newspapers and gym is available. In tune with the changing times, the College has established a modern Computer Lab, Multi-media Seminar Room and Fashion & Designing Lab, Language Lab.

The trust is presently led by S. Amarjit Singh Dakha (Patron) S. Anand Sarup Singh Mohie (President), Dr. Harbans Singh (Secretary) and S. Randhir Singh Dakha (Vice-President)

Having mission and vision of promoting education in rural area, the Trust started a sister institution of Management and Technology in 1997 where students from the rural area are getting graduation in Computer Application (B.C.A.) and Postgraduation in Information Technology (M.Sc. IT), MBA, BBA etc.

## Admission to B.A. (Semester System)

#### ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION:

A person who has passed one of the following examinations with pass in English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join the First Semester class of B.A. degree course. However, a person who has not qualified English as one of the subjects at the +2 examination shall be eligible to join B.A. 1st Sem. provisionally subject to his/her qualifying the deficient subject of English from the Parent Board/ Body/ Council/ Uni. in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission failing which his/her admission stand cancelled.

- +2 Examination under 10+2+3 system of education of a recognized Board/ Council/ University.
- B.A. Part-I (old scheme) / Intermediate /Arts/Examination of Panjab University.

 Any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to (i) and (ii) above.

#### COMPARTMENT CANDIDATES:

If a candidate has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/ Body/ Council/ University in India, he/she shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of B.A. provided he fulfills the following conditions:

- I He/She should have been placed in compartment in one subject only.
- He/She should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he had been placed in compartment.
- He/She should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

Provided that the candidate should have obtained at least 33% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects (including the marks obtained by him/her in the subject of compartment, Theory & Pratical/s taken together) taken up by him/her at the +2 examination.

Note: The candidate securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment at the +2 examination be made eligible to join B.A. Part I course, if they cleared or secure 20% or more marks in the subject in the Supplementary Examination held in July/August, on or before the last date for admssion with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, provided the seat/s is / are available.

### Subjects in B.A. I, II & III

- I Every student will be required to take up English and Punjabi/History & Culture of Punjab (HCP)\*
- ii. Any three elective subjects out of the following:
  - a. History
- b. Political Science
- c. Punjabi (Elective) d. Sociology
- Fashion Designing/ Fundamentals of Computer Application / Functional English/ Advertising Sales Promotion and Sales Management
- f. Economics OR Physical Education

#### NOTE:

- Environment, Road Safety Education and Violence against Women and Children and Drug is a compulsory paper, which the students are required to pass with atleast 33% marks either in the First Year (Semester System) or in Second Year/ Third Year of the Course, failing which the Degree will not be issued.
- Seats are limited in the subjects of Physical Education.

\* The subject of HCP can be taken up by only those students who are eligible as per the relevant rules of P.U. CHD.

## Eligibility conditions for B.A. II & III (Semester III, IV, V & VI)

The candidate who is admitted in 1st, 3rd and 5th semester will be allowed promoted to 2nd, 4th and 6th Sem. respectively, for this the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total papers till that semester.



## Admission to Post-Graduate Courses

### Eligibility Conditions for M.A. 1st Semester

Admission to the above will be open to students with

I. 45% in B.A. I, II, &III in the particular subject. OR

ii. 50% in aggregate.

OR

- iii. Any other equivalent examination declared so by the PU, Chd.
- iv. Master's degree examination in any other subject.

### Eligibility Conditions for M.A. 2nd, 3rd & 4th Semester

Persons who have passed one of the following examinations are eligible to join 2nd 3rd & 4th semester:

- Semester Ist, IInd and IIIrd examination in the subject offered from the college.
- (ii) Semester Ist, IInd and IIIrd examination in the subject offered from Kurukshetra/ Punjabi/ Guru Nanak Dev/ Maharishi Daya Nand/ Himachal Pradesh University provided he/she offered the same papers as are available at this University.







#### Note:

- A student for Semester IIIrd & IVth examination must have passed Semester Ist & IInd examination not more than five years previously.
- Compartment students of other University are not eligible to join M.A. Semester IIIrd of this University.
- The written examination to be conducted by the University in each paper shall carry 80% marks and internal assessment shall carry 20% marks.

## Admission To B.Com - I (Semester system)

- The duration of Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.) programme shall by of three years (six semesters).
- Admission to the first semester of B.Com. Degree course shall be open to a person who has passed one of the following examinations conducted by a recognized Board/ Council/ University:
- a) +2 examination or B.Com Part-I (old scheme) of Panjab University with three of the following subjects securing at least 45 per cent marks in the aggregate:-
  - Commerce (or theory of commerce or foundation course in commerce)
  - Accountancy (or book keeping and accountancy)
  - Economics
  - Business Organization (or Business Management or Theory and Practice of Management).
  - Insurance (or General Insurance or Life Insurance)
  - Banking and Trade
  - Commercial Geography
  - Office Management and Secretarial Practice (or Office Organization and Management)
  - · Mercantile Law (or any Company Law)
  - Auditing
  - Typewriting and Stenography/Computers (for typewriting)
- b) +2 Examination or B.A. Part-1 (Old Scheme) of Panjab University with at least two of the subjects mentioned in (a) securing at least 50% marks in aggregate;

- c) +2 Examination or B.A. Part-1/B.Sc.I/Pre-Engineering/Pre-Medical Examination of the Panjab University under the Old Scheme not covered in (b) securing at least 50% marks.
- d) Any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to (a) or (b) or (c) as given above with requisite percentage of marks given under each clause.

Provided that a candidate seeking admission to the first year of B.Com. should have passed in the subject of English at the +2 examination and in cases where passing in English is not necessary according to the regulations of certain Boards/ Bodies/ Councils/Universities in India, the admission of the candidate shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after he/she has cleared the subject of English as a deficient subject from the parent Board/Council/University in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission. In case a candidate does not clear the relevant subject at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to him subsequent to the date of his admission, his provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled.

#### Provided further that:

A candidate who has been placed under compartment in the +2 examination conducted by a Board/ Bodies/ Councils/ University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Sem. of B.Com. Course, Provided he fulfills the following conditions:

- He/She should have been placed in compartment in one subject only;
- (ii) He/She should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he had been placed in

compartment; and

(iii) He/She should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of the examination as laid down in the relevant regulations.

The admission of the candidate with a compartment as indicated above shall be provisional and will be confirmed only after he has cleared the compartment in two consecutive chances subsequent to his admission. In case the candidate does not clear the compartment at any of the two consecutive chances allowed to him subsequent to the date of his admission, his provisional admission to the course shall stand cancelled.

### Note:

- The candidate securing less than 20% marks in the subject of compartment at the +2 examination be made eligible to join B.Com. Part-I course, if they cleared or secure 20% or more marks in the subject in the Supplementary Examination held in July/ August, on or before the last date for admssion with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, provided the seat/s is / are available
- 3. The First Semester examination shall be open to a student who-
- (i) has been on the rolls of the college during one semester preceding the first semester examination;
   and
- (ii) has attended not less than 75% of the lectures, for each paper; a deficiency up to 10% may be condoned by the Principal of the college.

- (iii) Has obtained at least 25% marks in the aggregate of all the papers to be calculated on the basis of the results of house examinations/Class tests.
- (iv) The candidate who is admitted in 1st, 3rd and 5th semester will be allowed promoted to 2nd, 4th and 6th Sem. respectively, for this the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total papers till that semester.

### NOTE:

Environment, Road Safety Education and Violence against Women and Children and Drug is a compulsory paper, which the students are required to pass with atleast 33% marks either in the First Year (Semester System) or in Second Year/ Third Year of the Course, failing which the Degree will not be issued.

- The Second, Third, fourth, Fifth and Sixth Semester examinations shall be open to a regular student who-
- (a) has been on the rolls of the college during one semester preceding the Second, Third, fourth, Fifth and Sixth semester examination, as the case may be;
- (b) has attended not less than 75% of the lectures, for each paper; a deficiency up to 10% may be condoned by the Principal of the college.
- (c) has obtained at least 25% marks in the aggregate of all papers to be calculated on the results of house examinations/Class tests.
- (d) has passed the First, Second, Third, Fourth or Fifth Semester examination respectively or is covered under Re-appear Regulations of PU Chd.
- (e) The candidate who is admitted in first/third/fifth semester will be allowed to be promoted to second/fourth/sixth semester respectively, for this the candidate will have to clear 50% of the total papers till that semester.

## Admission to M.Com - I & II (Semester System)

### **Eligibility Conditions:**

- (a) B.Com./BBA with not less than 45% marks in the aggregate. OR
- (b) B.Com. (Hons.) degree with not less than 45% marks in the aggregate OR
- (c) A graduate with Honours in Economics or Mathematics or Statistics or Commerce with not less than 45% marks in the aggregate OR
- (d) A graduate with 50% marks in the aggregate having offered Economics, Mathematics, Statistics, Commerce, Computer Applications or Computer Sciences as a subject in the examination:

Provided that in case of students having Bachelor's degree of the university through Modern Indian Language (Hindi/Urdu/Punjabi) (Gurmukhi Script) and in a Classical Language (Sanskrit/Persian/ Arabic) or degree of any other University obtained in the same manner recognized by the Syndicate; 50% marks in the aggregate shall be calculated by taking into account full percentage of marks in all the papers in Language excluding the additional optional paper, English and the elective subject taken together; OR

- (e) An associate of the (i) Institute of Chartered accountants of India or England or (ii) Institute of cost and work Accountants of India or England OR
- (f) A pass in the final examination conducted by the institute of Company secretaries of India; OR
- (g) Graduate from any other stream not covered in (a) to (e) above with not less than 60% marks in the aggregate

### Admission to M.Com - III & IV (Semester System)

Third and fourth semester admission/examinations shall be open to a student who:-

- has passed M.Com. Ist and 2nd semester from college and has been on the roll of the College during the academic year preceding M.Com. 3rd and 4th semester examination.
- (ii) has passed 50% of the prescribed papers of 1st and 2nd semester jointly.

Note: Students with Reappear in UG Classes

## Admission to PGDMC Post Graduate Diploma in Mass Communication

**Eligibility:** The admission to the course shall be open to any person who has passed Bachelor"s Degree examination in any faculty from Panjab University or any other University recognised as equivalent thereto. **OR** A candidate who appeared under semester system for undergraduate courses and has upto two re-appears is also allowed to take admission under semester system in PGDMC.

**Course Structure:** This course comprises of 5 papers of 900 marks during the entire session. In each semester students study four theory papers, each carrying 100 marks, while they have a practical component of 50 marks. Paper I-IV gives a comprehensive overview of Mass Communication, Print Media, Electronic Media, Advertising and Public Relation. Paper-V in both the semesters has a mandatory practical assignment.

## Admission to B.Sc (Non-Medical)- 1st Semester:-

(i) A person who has passed one of the following examinations with pass in English as one of the subjects shall be eligible to join the First Semester class of B.Sc. (General) degree course in a College affiliated to this University, however, a person who has not qualified English as one of the subjects at the +2 examinations, shall be eligible to join B.Sc.-1st Semester provisionally subject to his/her qualifying the deficient subject of English from the parent Board/Body/Council/University in two consecutive chances subsequent to his/her admission, failing which his/her admission to B.Sc. 1st Semester and the result for the examination shall automatically stand cancelled:

- (a) B.A./B.Sc./B.Com Part-I(Old Scheme)/Intermediate/Arts/Science/Agriculture examination of Panjab University;
- (b) the +2 examination under 10+2+3 system of education of a recognized University/Board/Council;
- (c) PrakShastri/Vishard examination with compulsory English. (Vide SenatePara-LXXVII dated 06.12.2009);
- (d) any other examination recognized by the University as equivalent to (a), (b) and(c) above. Provided that:-
- (a) a person joining the B.Sc. course must have obtained at least 40 percent marks in the aggregate of the qualifying examination;
- (b) a B.Sc. student must have out of the three elective subjects offered by him/her (excepting Anthropology) passed at least 2 Science subjects in the qualifying examination. He/she may offer the third elective subject from the Faculty of Science or Faculty of Arts.
- (ii) A candidate who has been placed under compartment at +2 examination conducted by a Board/Body/Council/University in India shall be eligible to seek admission to the First Semester of B.Sc. course he/she fulfills the following conditions:-
- (a) He/she should have been placed in compartment in one subject only;
- (b) He/she should have obtained at least 20% marks in the subject in which he/she had been placed in compartment and;
- (c) He/she should have obtained the requisite percentage of marks in the aggregate of examination as laid down in the relevant regulations; Provided that;
- (a) A candidate joining the B.Sc. First Semester should have obtained at least 40% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects (including the marks obtained by him/her in the subject of compartment, Theory & Practical/s taken together) taken up by him/her at the +2 examination

## Change of Subjects

Students must give a serious thought before picking up the elective subjects, so that office and concerned professors need not undergo unnecessary botheration.

Yet, in accordance with instructions from the University, students can change subjects within 15 days of the commencement of the first session or from the date of joining the college, whichever is later.

When a student changes his/ her subject/ subjects, he/ she should get his/ her name removed from the rolls of the earlier subject/ subjects teacher. In case of non-compliance, he/she will be responsible for any shortage of lectures on this account.

### **Casual Students**

Casual students may be admitted only if space permits, and their applications are recommended by professors of the subjects concerned.

The students shall pay fees for the months during which they attend classes. They will be permitted to attend lectures in one or two subjects only. They do not have all the privileges which are open to regular students. They are required to pay full fees for the months they wish to study. They will also deposit Rs. 250.00 (Refundable) as security (subject to revision).

Provisional Admission is not allowed.

## **Fee Concessions**

- Half fee concession up to a limit of 10 percent of the total enrolment in each class.
- Full fee concession to the students belonging to Scheduled Caste or other Backward Classes in accordance with government instructions.
- Financial Aid from Students Aid Fund and Students Scholarship Fund to poor and deserving students

- Concessions/ stipends/ scholarships to deserving sports persons.

- Liberal Fee concession to deserving students.

 Principal can withdraw the stipend and fee concession if the beneficiary commits misconduct, creates indiscipline, fails in any House Examinations/ Test or for any other reason whatsoever Awards and Prizes.

Separate common room facilities are provided for the boys and girls in the college campus. The students can spend their leisure time in common rooms. The girl's common room is equipped with LED TV also.

### **Leave Rules**

- The application should be made on the prescribed form obtainable from the college office.
- Application for more than three days must be submitted to the Principal with recommendations from the teacher teaching compulsory subject.
- A Student may be granted leave from an examination/monthly test only by the Principal on extreme compassionate grounds. In such case application should be recommended by the

- teacher teaching elective subject. However, such leave cannot be treated as exemption from University conditions.
- Before availing leave a student should check that the same has been granted by the proper authority. In case of illness the student should inform the Principal about this fact on the very first day.
- Application of sick leave for more than a week must be supported by a medical certificate from a qualified Physician.

## Remedial / Special Coaching Classes

Remedial coaching is provided particularly to the new learners or to the students who have Compartments especially in the subject of English. UGC, too, has been helping in this venture.

### Absence without leave

- Students will be fined Re. 2/- for absence for one period and Rs. 10/- for whole of the day.
- The names of students who remain absent without leave for 07 days continuously from a subject/class will be struck off of the college rolls. They can be re-admitted on payment of special fine within 10 days.
- If the name of a student is struck off for the second time, he/she shall not be re-admitted except with the special permission of the Principal.
- A student absent from the class for three days continuously will be reported to the Principal by the teacher concerned for action.
- A special fine is imposed on students absenting themselves from college functions.

### Mid Semester Test & Class Tests

- MST Examinations are compulsory for all the students. The students who absent themselves from House Examinations without leave from the concerned authority will be fined at the rate of Rs. 200/- per paper.
- If any student is found resorting to unfair means in the House Examination he/she will be fined Rs. 200./- and his/her result of the whole examination stands cancelled.
- All the concessions, stipends, etc. are granted on the basis of House Examinations.
- Absence or exemption from the MST or Class Test is treated as failure.

### Conditions for Admission to University Examinations

- A student is eligible for the University Examination only if he/she secures 25% marks in aggregate or 20% marks in each subject of the group offered by him/her in the MST and or Class Test held by the college.
- A student is required to attend at least 75% lectures for appearing in the University Examination in case of undergraduate classes and 66% in case of P.G. Classes.

Note: It is in the interest of the student to get reassured from their teachers from time to time about the attendance he/she has registered.

## Library and Reading Room

- · The College has a magnificent library having near about 16500 volumes. The library also subscribes to 46 periodicals and 17 newspapers.
- · The library has a sitting arrangement of approximately 100 students.
- · The Library has Encyclopedia Britannica and several rare books.
- · It has got many soft books in shape of CDs, DVDs etc.
- · The Members of the College staff and students on rolls of the college are entitled to use the library and borrow books for reading at their own.
- · Members of the staff will be entitled to keep books for one month whereas the students can keep general Books for 14 days and Text books for 2 days. A book, if not in demand by others, can be re-issued on return.
- · A fine of Rs. 5/- per day will be charged from students for non-compliance of the rule.
- · Every student is supplied a borrower's card, which is stamped each time a book is borrowed or returned.
- · Any person who loses, defaces or in any way damages a library book is liable to pay twice the cost of replacement or in the event of the book being one of a series the cost of replacement of the whole set or series.
- The issuance of books will be closed for two weeks for stock taking purpose.
- Students, who wish to borrow books for the













security deposit with the permission of the Principal.

- · 2 books of the syllabus are issued at a time for under graduate students for a period of 10 days and general book will be issued for 14 days.
- · 4 books of syllabus & general book are issued at a time for post graduate student for period of 14 days.
- · Best library users among teachers and students are rewarded at the Annual Function.
- · The College has a digital library with computer's and internet facilities.
- · College has subscribed to the UGC NLIST, which is available for teachers and students.
- · The college library has a repository of spoken English books, CD's and IELTS books for use of students to learn the English language besides their normal course.

Summer Vacation, have to get the books issued against . LED TV is displayed for informational Purposes of the students.

## **PU Extension Library** Ludhiana Membership

## **Awards & Prizes**

- Athletes, getting first, second or third positions in various events in the Annual Athletic Meet are awarded prizes. The best athlete among boys and the best athlete among girls are given trophies and cash prizes.
- Prizes for the other co-curricular activities are also offered.
- The principal issues notices in this connection from time to time.







## Roll of Honour /College Colour

Roll of Honour/ College Colour/ Merit certificate is awarded to a student for outstanding achievements in the academics, sports, athletics, and cultural fields.

Roll of Honour can be repeated only if the new achievement of the student is in a different field or in a different class. The following rules govern the award of the Roll of Honour.

### 1. Academics

- A. Roll of Honour in academics will be awarded to a student who passes the Board/ University Examination with a position in Merit List. Or The student is placed among the Top Ten in the University Examination.

- \* To the members of the winning and runner- up team in the Junior National championship and to the player who scores first, second or third position in the individual Competition.
- \* To the members of the Combined University Team.
- To the Captain of the University Team or Punjab State Senior.
- To the new record holder in the University or State Competitions.

### B. College Colour:

College colour in Sports will be awarded to the student:

Who represents the University or the State.

- Who stands first, second or third in individual competition of State (Senior)/University or who stands first in State Junior Championship.
- Best Athlete of the College who establishes a new college record provided he/she has participated in the University Athletic Meet.
- Captain of the College team which enters the semi-final after winning at least two matches.

- To the Captain of the Team which stands first in Panjab University Zonal Youth Festival.

#### A. Roll of Honour will be awarded:

- To a cadet who represents the State and scores first or second position in the State level N.C.C. competitions.
- To the cadet who represents the State in Republic Day Parade.
- To a Volunteer who scores first or second position in N.S.S. and Youth Services National Competition.

### B. College Colour is presented:

- To a cadet who represents the college in the parade at State Level Function.
- \* To a Volunteer who stands first or second in N.S.S. and Youth Services State Competition.


